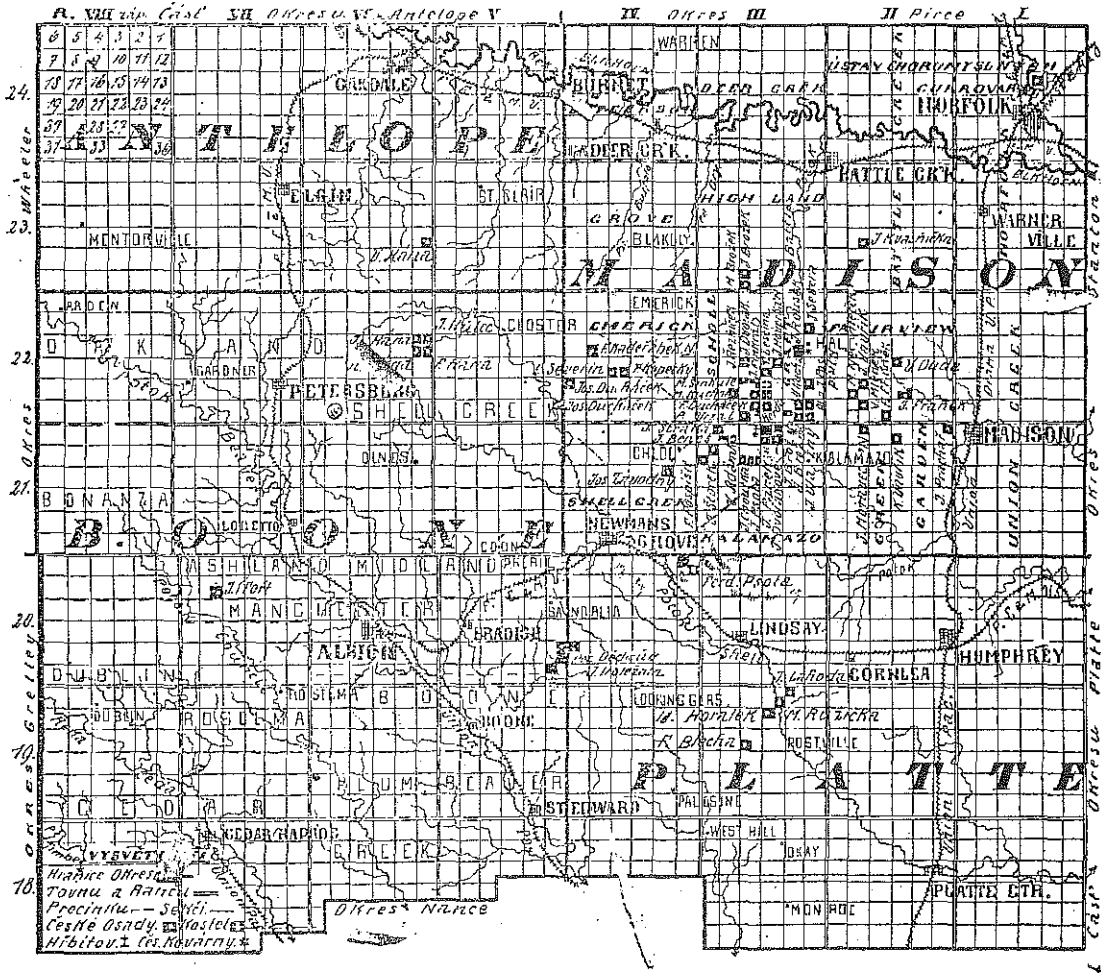


ANTELOPE COUNTY MADISON COUNTY

FRANKLIN COUNTY, NEBRASKA

(Franklin Co.) lies near the border of Kansas. Population is 7,650 and Bloomington is the county seat. The topography is gently rolling prairie, and here and there, it forms deep valleys. Soil is fertile and in and around the valleys of the Republican River in places is sandy soil. Land prices are from \$6.00 to \$15.00 according to location. Water for drinking is good tasting and healthy and is found 50 to 100 feet deep.

Czech families number three and are in the south east part of the county near town of North Franklin which is three miles west of the post-office of Campbell on the railroad of B. & M.

ANTELOPE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

(Antelope Co.) lies in middle northeast part of the state. Population is 10,376. Neligh, which is five miles northwest from Oakdale line, is the county seat and land is predominantly fertile. Topography is gently rolling prairie. Although along the Elkhorn River is fertile, there are quite a few places that are sandy. Soil is almost entirely fertile. Cost of land is \$10.00 to \$20.00 per acre depending on location.
