

CHEYENNE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

(It) lies in the southwestern part of the state bordering Colorado. Sidney, where the division of the U.P. Railroad and government land agency are located, is the county seat. Not far from the town is the army post of Fort Sidney.

The topography here is more or less rolling and in many places found to be rocky, some crops here are in rows(apparently describing strip-farming) layered on the level land. Higher and lower hills penetrate the county adding in many places in the region a sort of romantic character, mainly parts of the northwest, where long valleys, both sides boxed by a chain of mountains, and the tops are cone shaped; beyond are steep straight slopes where the water grinds out a channel, again the tops resemble the ruins of a Czech or European old castle.

Along the U.P. Railroad runs the Lodge Pole Creek and enough water is supplies for irrigation, the allowance being about three miles wide, (of course at times it is lower), on the whole it produces good crops of hay, where on the alkali valley land, it's the most valuable product.

Remarkable layers of rock, can protrude from a field into mountains and hills on both sides of the valley and further around the countryside it's desolate, wild and completely bad. One finds, however, further south behind the first chain of mountains, not far is found a Czech settlement. The land is moderately rolling and the crops, as a whole, is more fertile, of course, in many places there is gravel. Everyone around here who intends to move to a new place must himself be sure of the land in that part of the county, where it is taken or bought and even in small stretches there is a difference.

To further the bond that forced the circumstances which led to the sharpest controversy in the Czech periodicals, brought some outsiders to observe here our countrymen and Mr. V. Kucera, the first settler, who became the land agent. The struggle was led by both sides, and without any proof accused the land agent that he always had the best land (of course, it was an accusation of conduct). It forced the other side to hurry to Sidney with rocks that they had scratched out of the soil as proof or evidence. In this part of Cheyenne County, not even a rabbit could exist.

I found here the countrymen quite satisfied and in spite of the bad reproval, they like elsewhere in other Czech settlements are capable of good judgment. We have here an example of a greater and longer duration of crop failure though more land, since our arrival. In the settlement there are 57 Czech families and several unmarried young men who exchange work on shares with the proprietor, where elsewhere they may work for their keep. Water for drinking here is good on the higher prairie, although quite deep, 100 to 200 feet. The price of land ranges from \$150 to \$500 or more for 160 acres, depending on the land or whether it is built up.

The other Czech settlement is found 12 miles north of Potter where three families have settled, where the land is moderately rolling and crops quite good, but depending on the moisture. The countryside here is mostly overgrown with trees on the hillsides. When the crops are poor a living is made from the trees for wood cutting, the trees are free as long as they are not taken on government land.
