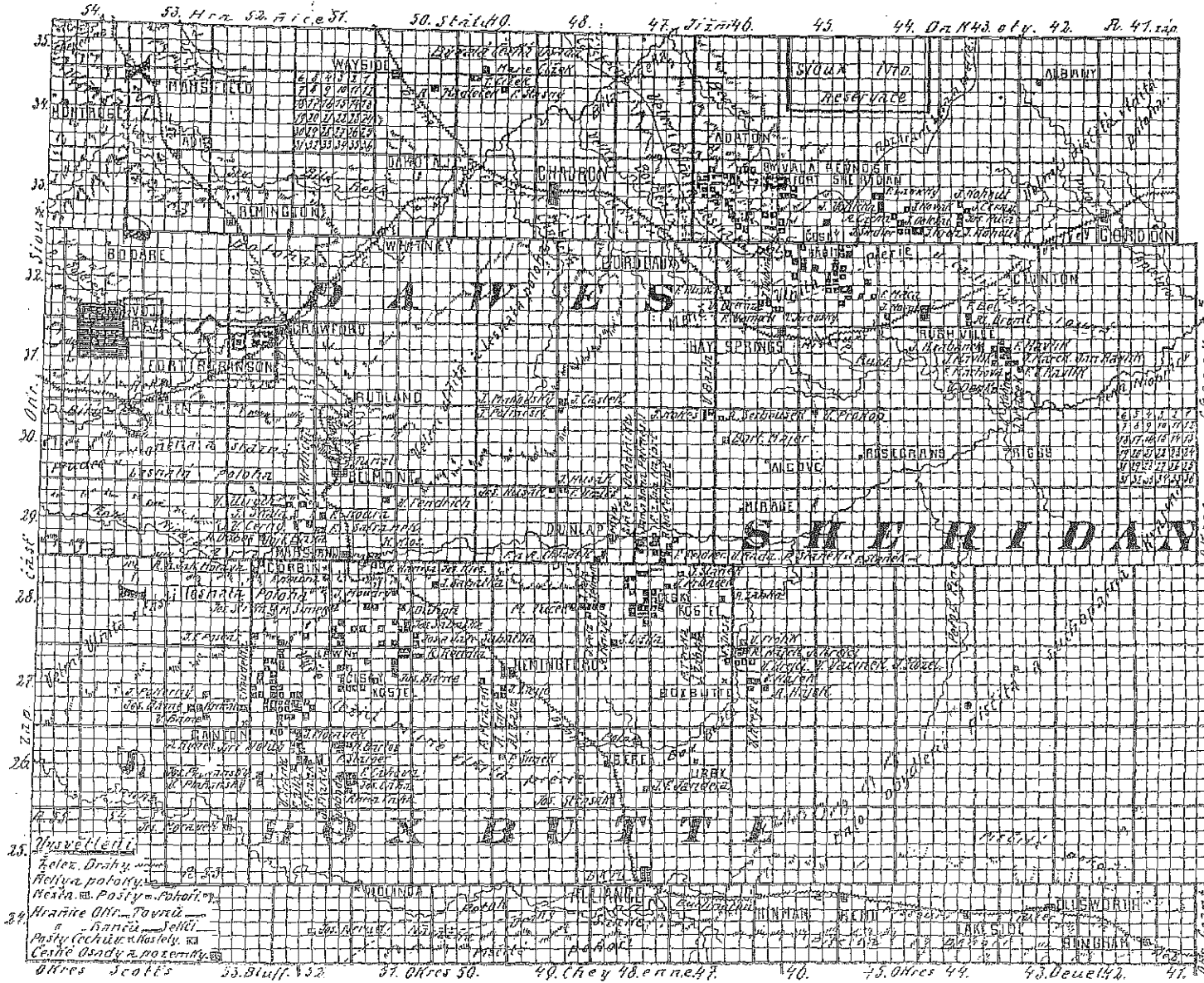


Mapa okresů Box Butte, Dawes, Sioux a Sheridan.

DAWES COUNTY, NEBRASKA

(It) lies in the northwestern part of the state bordering Dakota. It has 9690 inhabitants. Chadron is the county seat, also the seat of the government land office and a division of the F.E. & M.V. Railroad. Another larger town is Crawford near the crossing of the F.E. & M.V. and B & M Railroads. The towns have the best business as not far is found the army post of the United States at Fort Robinson where the last strong government enlargement is coming to an end.

The topography in the county is greatly different. From the southwestern part to the northeastern direction there are mountains of various shapes and structures which are covered with trees. The thriving settlers here and the neighboring ones in Box Butte County provide wood for domestic use, and in the barren land for sale at market. The rest of the land is moderately rolling prairie, the more level land is around Wayside, where used to be a larger Czech Community, about 45 families living there. Because of the continuing drouth and bad crops along with the salty alkaline water that was around, a number of them decided to move in a hurry to be on their own land in the eastern part near Adaton in Sheridan County in Nebraska, where in time the army post, Fort Sheridan was opened. All that were left here were 2 families who still live here. The land belonging to the Czechs is of course mostly on quarters. However, it is difficult to get introduced and to learn about them. The majority living here, seeing failure, tried taking out a loan to obtain money on part of their land where otherwise till now, was their own, however without the proper regulation in that the proprietor in as much as the owner, in fact had money in the loan association.

Along the White River and the Niobrara are found valleys two to four miles wide. Here the soil is mostly sandy and in places very salty and alkaline. In the valleys, the water isn't very deep, however on the higher ground, it can be 150 to 250 feet deep, yes, in fact deeper.

Czech communities in the county are two, but in several different places settled singly. Most of the Czech settlers are around the postoffice of Dunlap in the southeastern tip of the county near the Niobrara River, meeting with the settlement in Box Butte County. A water mill was built by Mr. Vojt. Chladek, he was also an owner of mixed business (referring to a general store) and postmaster of Dunlap. The mill was the only one of Czech ownership in western Nebraska. A hall was built by the Czech Lodge Ochotnicka (Amateur Theatre). At times the dramatic group would put on a play. It was always well received and was supported by surrounding settlers. It was always orderly, everyone hurried to visit with one another.

The other settlement is found in the southeastern tip of the county along that same Niobrara River, near Marshland, northwest of the town, the land being rolling and riddled with deep gullies. This community lies below the hills which are overgrown with trees. In the higher ground, water is found to be deep so settlers didn't dig wells, getting their water from the river, which caused a great hardship. The Czechs live mostly at Chadron and Crawford. The first Czech to settle in the county was Jind. Stepan followed by other countrymen. Another settler F.A. Fafek, was very skillful as he knew how to put cornices on houses. He was also head worker on the army barracks.
